#### D. Reports to Committee

Chad Lillethun presented on DHS' assessment of county fees when services are provided. Lillethun explained the two types of fees that are assessed: (1) fees associated with the placement of children into substitute care which use the child support calculations; (2) fees associated with in home services as a result of delinquencies. Under the first type of fees, the costs associated with placement can vary significantly. The impact on families can be reduced through the application of special factors. In 2018, these fees totaled \$925,000. Under the second type of fees, the costs are much lower. In 2018, the total fees for in-home services was approximately \$1,400 and for delinquency supervision \$6,000.

Judge Nicholas McNamara presented on the practical application of court costs and fees. Judge McNamara described the various legal financial obligations that are imposed on individuals who have been convicted of a crime. Judge McNamara highlighted two reports that dealt with such obligations, which have been attached.
