2019DE MINIMIS DETERMINATION - WIS 19ACT-065

Marsh reviewed WisDOT's Section 4(f) Deminimis documentation for the STH 19 road corridor safety improvements related to Indian Lake and Halfway Prairie Park properties that would be impacted by the road project. WisDOT has proposed to mitigate impacts to the park and improve pedestrian safety by providing an underpass. The underpass would accommodate use of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail and park patrons crossing STH 19. WisDOT's design for the underpass includes a 90" corrugated culvert. WisDOT provided a cost estimate for culvert design and an estimate for a concrete box culvert that could be considered if additional funds from Dane County or other partners could be secured.

Park Commission reviewed the current proposal and asked staff to meet with WisDOT planners to reevaluate the current design, including items concerning lighting, aesthetics, maintenance and safety. The Commission also asked staff to look into Dane County and WisDot contributing 50/50 for a box culvert.

G. Reports to Committee

1. Indian Lake Chapel - Fence Replacement Donation Project

Marsh provided an overview of the history and significance of the Indian Lake Chapel, including the Endres family who built the chapel in 1857. A few of the Endres family members have made a donation to replace and upgrade the old painted fence around the chapel. The proposed fence is a wrought iron fence that will match the historic character of the chapel. Marsh is working with the County Historical Society for approvals for the project. LUNNEY indicated that he would like to send a letter to the family thanking them for their donation.

2. Black Earth Wildlife Area - Utility Corridor

Marsh provided an update on the County's position on the proposed Cardinal Hickory Creek Transmission Corridor that will impact the Black Earth Wildlife Area Sunnyside Unit. The County's position is that the new transmission corridor should be located south of Hwy 14, following the transportation corridor. The current line that traverses over the bluff should be relocated to the new corridor and existing corridor should be restored back to a natural condition.

H. Annoucements

 LUNNEY announced his retirement as Park Commission Chair effective June 30th. He thanked everyone at the meeting for their hard work and commitment to conservation, noting each of their unique qualities that they brought to their work. LUNNEY indicated that the Foundation for Dane County Parks received an \$8,000 grant from the Madison Community Foundation for developing accessible fishing and boating improvements throughout the Dane County Park system.
