F. Presentations

Jim Welsh and Kevin Thusius provided a joint presentation of their Conservation Fund Projects as both are working with the Festge family on lands near each other. Both projects are within the Dane County Black Earth Creek Natural Resource Area and WDNR Black Earth Creek Fishery Area.

Groundswell proposes to purchase 5.2 acres along STH 14 which includes areas within the floodplain of Black Earth Creek. It is directly adjacent to the WDNR Fishery Area and once restored, will provide public access as well as wildlife and water quality enhancements to the area. The property will be open to public recreation including hunting, hiking and cross-county skiing. Groundswell has applied for a Knowles Nelson Stewardship grant in the amount of \$52,000 and has received a \$1000 donation from the Southern Wisconsin Chapter of Trout Unlimited and \$10,000 in private gifts and asked for a Dane County Conservation Fund grant award of \$41,000.

The Ice Age Trail Alliance project is 45.7 acres and is adjacent to current ownership. The site includes an unglaciated hill (called the Mammoth's Back) and provides excellent views of the Black Earth Valley and the terminus of the glacier as it advanced down the valley. The site will have some continued farming while other areas will be reclaimed for wetlands and prairie/oak savannah restoration. The property will be open to public recreation including hunting, fishing, hiking and cross-country skiing. Ice Age Trail Alliance is awaiting a \$202,500 Knowles Nelson Stewardship Grant and has received a \$10,000 donation from the Dane County Ice Age Trail Alliance chapter and a private gift in the amount of \$5000 from Gary Werner. The Alliance has applied for a Dane County Conservation Fund grant in the amount of \$213,750.

Gary Werner spoke in favor of both purchases. Both projects provide outstanding resource value for the community while filling in the gaps for a number of large land based project plans. Mr. Werner stated that he is donating to this project in order to preserve and protect these valuable resource areas.

1. Fish Lake Flooding - Darren Marsh

Marsh and RIPP provided an update on the flooding at Crystal Lake and Fish Lake and the steps that were being taken to prepare for additional flooding. RIPP noted that the water has come up between four and five feet since late in 2017. Portions of Fish Lake and Mussen Roads where under as much as three feet of water and closed to public use. Fish Lake Park is no longer accessible. Park staff prepared Fish Lake Park for the anticipated flooding by protecting a fresh water well and pumping out the restroom facility. At Lussier Park they removed the boat dock. At the present time Lussier Park will remain open to provide access to Fish Lake.
