E. Items Requiring Committee Action

1. Initial Discussion and Possible Action on Planning for Nonpartisan Redistricting Processand Determination of Number of Districts

Karin Peterson-Thurlow gave an update on the Non-Partisan Redistricting process:

- In April, once the new board is seated, this topic will be listed as a standing item on the first meeting agenda of the month for the Executive Committee.

- An issue brief will be developed for the supervisors to address the topic of county board size considerations

- Discussion of board size will be one of the key topics of discussion on the redistricting process agenda item.

- Executive Committee can bring in the WCA to give a presentation on this topic.

- The Executive Committee anticipates that by August a resolution could be introduced for board action before the budget.

2. Discussion and Possible Action on Biennial Update of Ch 7 County Board Rules

Chair Eicher indicated that the Executive Committee would consider and then vote on proposed changes to Ch 7 at its arch 19 meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT: The Board of Health for Madison and Dane County submitted the following statement:

"The BOHMDC unanimously supports changes to ordinance 7.51 in support of additional modes of Board participation. Amending Ord 7.51 to state, "Board members are expected to attend meetings in person, but may participate in a meeting, including counting for quorum and voting, via telephone or other electronic media if such participation is specifically noticed on the agenda for the member at least 24 hours prior to the meeting." to allow remote quorum and voting would provide more equitable access to meetings for the public, contribute to infection control, and help achieve sustainability goals."

Peterson-Thurlow presented on staff changes to Ch 7 (based on comments from supervisors over the last two years). Committee members discussed additional changes in the following sections, which will be made and brought back before the committee at its march 19 meeting for a final action: Sections:

- 7.11(10): Add Food Council, Parks Commission, and Extension to YGP committee lineup

- 7.13(11): Add language re: County Board Office Continuity of Operations Plan
- 7.22(14): Add language regarding technology changes (videoconference, etc.)
- 7.24(3): Change language to clarify no committee action will be taken.

Supervisor Wegleitner also spoke in support of her proposed changes to Chapter 7 Board Rules and took questions from the Committee..

The Committee will take final action on all proposed changes at its March 19 meeting.
