- •The strategic planning stakeholder email went out, however, workshops are postponed.
- Crisis billing update
- •BHRC workgroup update
- •BPHCC received a 92% excellent care rating in a recent customer satisfaction survey.
- •Coronavirus planning:
- -staff are testing capacity to work from home across the Department.

-We are talking to focal points about closing down meal sites and focusing on home delivered meals.

-Staff are not traveling to see out of state kids – use skype and other teleconferencing aids.

-Essential personnel have the ability to work from home.

-Same level of standard for foster care parents and focal points.

-BPHCC is restricting outside visitors and residents are not going out in the community.

-Courts are deferring or delaying hearings or using teleconference when able.

-Housing and homeless services – exploring access to additional shelter space.

-Beacon is reducing structured activities and more sanitization.
