3. Discussion and Possible Recommendations Regarding the 2021 City of Madison and Dane County Budgets

Committee members discussed supporting Occupy Madison's tiny house proposal. City and County staff provided information regarding the budget and zoning support currently being considered at the city and the county, including a budget amendment of \$450,000 at the county to support the project.

City and County staff answered the committee member's questions regarding alternate solutions the city and the county have explored to address unsheltered homelessness, and the budget process timeline.
