#### D. Action Items

2021 Healthy Community Food Systems Fund Application

-Madison Food Policy Council approved a motion to recommend that staff draft a resolution to be introduced at the 11/17/20 Madison Common Council meeting for final passage at the 12/1/20 Common Council meeting to combine the remaining 2018/2020 Healthy Retail Access Program funds with the 2021 Seed Grant funds to be divided into three programs:

- 1) \$150,000 for the Heathy Community Food Access Fund
- 2) \$100,000 for Rapid Food Access and Food Entrepreneur Support
- 3) \$18,000 for Regional Food System Planning

This would be a one year adjustment to conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic and the Seed Grant program would return to its original funding and purpose in 2022.

A motion was made by CATON CAMPBELL, seconded by TESCH, for Dane County Food Council to support the motion made by Madison Food Policy Council. The motion was carried by a voice vote 7-0.

2021 PIE Food Project Grant Application Updates about the 2021 PIE Food Project Grant will be shared at the December meeting.

—City of Madison Food Policy Director – George Reistad No additional updates beyond the previously discussed Healthy Community Food Systems Fund.

— Public Health Madison & Dane County – Nick Heckman

The COVID-19 pandemic has reached crisis levels throughout Wisconsin. Within the last month, PHMDC has moved to crisis levels of contact tracing, where all positive cases are still notified, but contact tracing is not able to be conducted in all cases. Hospitalizations and ICU usage has increased following case surges in September and October, and those measures are at 82% and 81% of capacity.

Heckman has been doing site visits to pantries to ensure they are prepared for safe outdoor food distribution this winter.

- RFP Applications are now being accepted for Dane County's COVID-19 Community Development Block Grant program, totaling more than \$1.76 million. The funding will be spent on projects that prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, including projects that increase access to food, provide health services, and other areas. Application deadline is 2pm on Thursday, November 19th.
- Edible Startup Summit 2020 is virtual and also statewide this year Monday & Tuesday, Nov. 9-10, 2020. The summit is organized by UW-Madison Extension Dane County and UW-Madison Extension Food Systems Program, with support from the Entrepreneur group of Dane County Food Council, FEED Kitchens, UW Food Finance Institute, UW-Madison's Law & Entrepreneurship Clinic, Compeer Financial, and Tribe 9 Foods. This event is packed with information about business planning, product development, on-line sales, marketing and branding, and pivoting in the time of Covid-19, and includes keynote talks, workshops, and networking sessions. - To assist farmers with choosing a software platform for their direct sales, Claire Strader, Extension Dane County Organic Vegetable Educator, worked with the CSA Innovation Network on a national survey of farmers to rate the software platforms to develop the Farmer to Farmer eCommerce Platforms Report. This report details farmer ratings for the most popular farm-specific or farm-friendly sales platforms. There will be a webinar on this report on November 17, and more farmer profiles and video tours are coming this fall.
