Report: The Steep Costs of Criminal Justice Fees and Fines

Bayrd discussed the scope of the subcommittee's charge, and presented a summary of the work the committee has undertaken. Baring provided additional information on how other jurisdictions tackled the fines and fees impact on various communities. Wegleitner reported that Human Services mailed out notification letters that certain fees were eliminated, and had identified another free to review. Davis provided a summary of what the committee has identified and what the committee could do going forward. Nelson inquired whether the committee's report could provide additional technical assistance to other counties. Baring suggested that the subcommittee reach out to other advisory committees in the county who are tackling the same issues. Wegleitner asked whether there was a way to invite others to attend the Sheriff's department presentation. Esqueda suggested that the role of municipal courts should be explored. Wegleitner asked if the formatting of the subcommittee's report could follow Nelson's recommendation.
