 Dane County TimeBank (Lorrie Hurckes Dwyer, Executive Director, and Ryan Eykholt, Transportation Coordinator)

Eykholt described the TimeBank transportation process including criteria for driver selection and types of rides provided. Similar to a volunteer driver program drivers receive mileage reimbursement. The COVID pandemic led to TimeBank transporting food and supplies rather than people. The program will ease back into transporting people using all COVID precautions recommended.

1. CRRSAA 5310 Funding (Ben Lyman, Transportation Planner, MPO)

Lyman explained the CRRSAA funding is to support projects effective in meeting present transportation needs or growing demand for existing transportation services that assist seniors, people with disabilities and those with limited income. #### 2. COVID Vaccination Transportation

Betzig predicted that numerous transportation requests to vaccination sites would overwhelm the Dane County Transportation Call Center. A second Call Center was designed to dispatch vaccination rides only. An employee was hired to staff the second Call Center. Call Center guidelines and ride tracking tools were designed. February 4, 2021 through February 18, 2021 111 one-way rides were scheduled.

## 3. WAMM Legislative Issues

#### **Betzig reported key WAMM State Transportation issues:**

- a. Increase in specialized Transportation s85.22 capital and operating funding 20% to assist with operations, replacement or acquisition of new transit vehicles and expanding mobility management services. Funding has remained the same for 10 years.
- b. Legislation be enacted to prohibit insurers form imposing surcharges, increasing rates or refusing to issue a policy solely because someone is a volunteer driver.
- c. Coordination among state and local transportation systems, including the creation of a statutory Transportation Coordination Council.

#### Betzig, reported key WAMM Federal Transportation Issues:

- a. Raise the charitable driving reimbursement rate for the first time in over 20 years to equal the current standard business mileage.
- b. Increase FTA Section 5310 funding and to continue to allow funds to be used for either capital assistance or operating assistance
