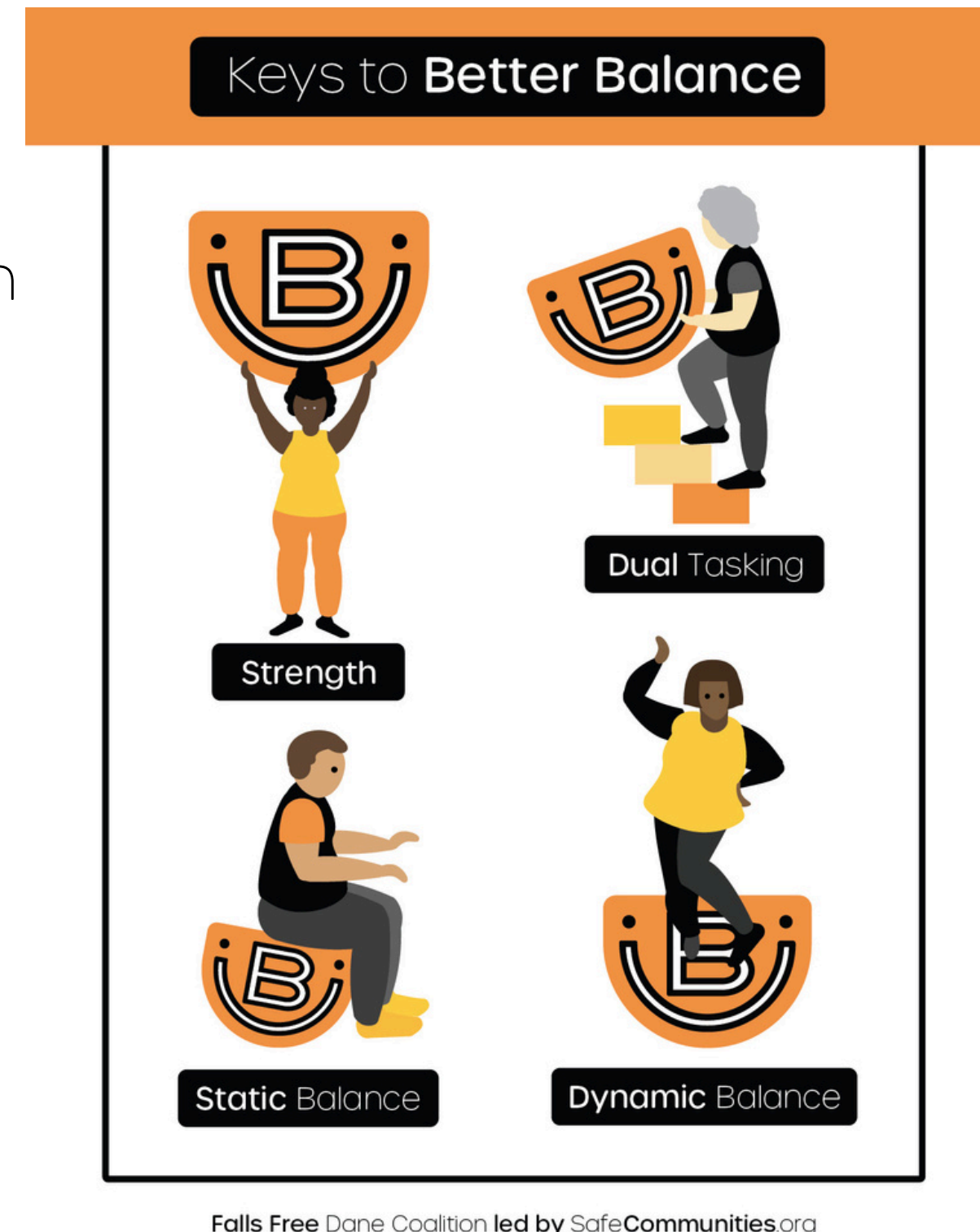

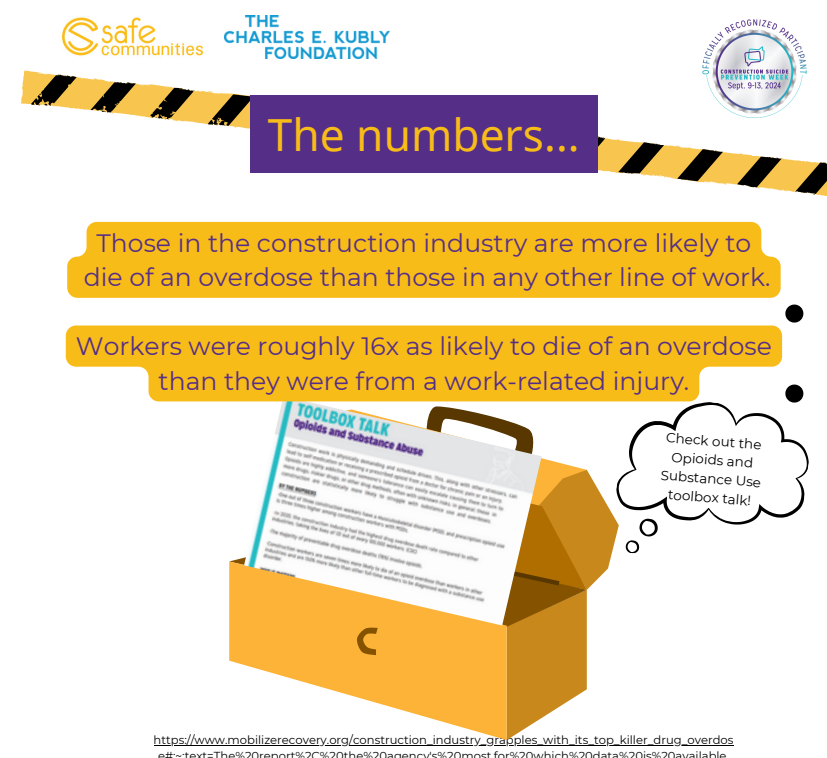

These Peer Specialists use their personal experiences to build trust and offer support to others on similar paths.

African American Opioid Coalition

The African American Opioid Coalition (AAOC) of Safe Communities is a coalition of Black treatment and health care providers, faith leaders, community advocates and people with lived experience committed to improving the wellness of Black families by addressing opioid and drug harm in Dane County's Black community. AAOC is a national pioneer in efforts to confront racial disparities in treatment availability, harm reduction services and culturally competent prevention education. Constructive action led by the AAOC is the result of advocacy and effective partnerships with trusted Black-led institutions including churches, nonprofits and service organizations.



African American Opioid Coalition

Mission:

To influence policy that impacts African Americans in the area of AODA services that will benefit families and the community at large.

Goals:

- To improve the overall wellness of Black families
- To educate about impacts of opioid addiction in the African American community
- To have a place at the table (not on the menu!) to inform policies and practices affecting Black families.

HOW:

- AFRICAN AMERICAN OPIOID COALITION (AAOC): NATIONAL PIONEER CONFRONTING DISPARITIES IN DRUG HARM

INTERSECTIONS:

AGE ADJUSTED OVERDOSE DEATH RATE IS 4x HIGHER AMONG BLACK PEOPLE THAN WHITE PEOPLE IN DANE COUNTY

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FACTORS, SUCH AS COGNITIVE IMPAIRMENT OR MEDICATION SIDE EFFECTS CAN INCREASE RISK OF FALLS AMONG OLDER ADULTS

ALCOHOL WAS A FACTOR IN 30% OF SERIOUS CRASHES IN DANE COUNTY

23% OF FATAL CRASHES IN DANE COUNTY ARE ASSOCIATED WITH DRUG/ALCOHOL USE

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FACTORS, SUCH AS COGNITIVE IMPAIRMENT OR MEDICATION SIDE EFFECTS CAN INCREASE RISK OF FALLS AMONG OLDER ADULTS

40% OF OLDER ADULTS WHO EXPERIENCE A SERIOUS FALL IN A NURSING HOME MAY HAVE CHRONIC PAIN & DEPRESSION

AFRICAN AMERICAN & LATINO YOUTH HAVE AMONG THE HIGHEST RATE OF SERIOUS CRASHES IN DANE COUNTY

HOW:

- ADDRESS FALLS AT SYSTEMIC & GRASSROOTS LEVELS TO STREAMLINE PROCESSES
- INCREASE ACCESS TO BALANCE-ENHANCING PROGRAMS TO EQUIP OLDER ADULTS WITH KNOWLEDGE, RESOURCES & SUPPORT TO PREVENT FALLS
- IMPLEMENT STEPPING ON AS HUB FOR PROGRAMS & ENGAGE COMMUNITY PARTNERS

COLLECTIVE IMPACT:

- 700+ PEOPLE REACHED THROUGH EVENTS SINCE 2020
- EXPANSION OF FALLS PREVENTION EVENTS IN UNDER-SERVED AREA
- ONLY LEAVES "SHOULD FALL" ANNUAL EVENT SCREENS OLDER ADULTS FOR FALL RISK & REFERRALS
- 14,000 SIGNS DISTRIBUTED
- MONTHLY CALL-IN SHOW ON TRAFFIC SAFETY TOPICS ON LA MOVIDA SPANISH RADIO
- AN AVERAGE OF 3-5 PEOPLE DIE BY VEHICULAR SUICIDE IN DANE COUNTY ANNUALLY
- 23% OF FATAL CRASHES IN DANE COUNTY WERE ASSOCIATED WITH ALCOHOL AND/OR DRUG USE
- AFRICAN AMERICAN & LATINO YOUTH HAVE AMONG THE HIGHEST RATE OF SERIOUS CRASHES IN DANE COUNTY

INTERSECTIONS:

FEAR OF FALLING CAN CONTRIBUTE TO REDUCED PHYSICAL ACTIVITY & SOCIAL ISOLATION

OLDER DRIVERS WITH A HISTORY OF FALLING ARE 40% MORE LIKELY TO BE INVOLVED IN CRASHES THAN THEIR PEERS

HOW:

- RECOGNIZE TRAFFIC SAFETY IMPACTS PUBLIC HEALTH, ECONOMIC STABILITY, COMMUNITY WELL-BEING
- COLLABORATE WITH DANE COUNTY TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION
- SHIFT BIASES & BEHAVIORS, ULTIMATELY REDUCING PREVENTABLE TRAFFIC CRASHES & FOSTERING A SUSTAINABLE CULTURE OF SAFETY

COLLECTIVE IMPACT:

- 76% OF DRIVERS SURVEYED REPORTED SLOWING DOWN AFTER SEEING A SLOW DOWN YARD SIGN
- AWARDED 3 NATIONAL HIGHWAY SAFETY ADMIN. DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS & PARTNER ON A 4TH
- YIELD-TO-PEDESTRIAN RATE AMONG MOTORISTS IS 89% WITH FLAGS & 11% WITHOUT
- LAW ENFORCEMENT SUBGROUP: ALL DANE COUNTY AGENCIES COLLABORATE ON EDUCATION & ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS
- 5 SCHOOLS IMPLEMENTED SOURCES OF STRENGTH & RECEIVE ONGOING TECHNICAL SUPPORT & TRAINING

- TEACH COMMUNITY TO RECOGNIZE SIGNS
