# Office Administered Programs

#### Vets Ride with Pride



Madison Metro "Fast Fare" cards issued at no cost to VA-rated disabled Veterans and those in receipt of needs-based VA Pension benefits.

#### **Emergency Assistance**



Limited funding for partial rent and utility assistance.
Dane VSC is overseeing body, though funds are administered by Veterans Service Office.

#### **Donated Aid**



Donated funds used for gas cards, grocery cards, and other forms of modest assistance for Veterans in times of need Funding limited.

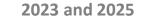
## Veterans Service Office – 2022 to Present

#### **PACT Act**

August 10, 2022. Largest expansion of Veterans legislation (health care and benefits) in history. Multilayered, impacting Veterans and survivors of many eras.

#### **Workload Expansion**

Substantial increase in benefit application submissions into Federal VA system following PACT Act with year-by-year growth. Total increase from 2022 to 2025 is 87.2%.

#### **County Support**

#### Increased demand for services

Immediate surge of business following President Biden's signing of PACT Act. One month of wait time for CVSO appts added almost instantly.

County Executive and County Board approved staffing increases in 2023 (up 2 F.T.E.) and 2025 (up 1 F.T.E.). While now at 9 F.T.E. overall, office remains understaffed compared to counterparts statewide, though we are very grateful for the ongoing support.

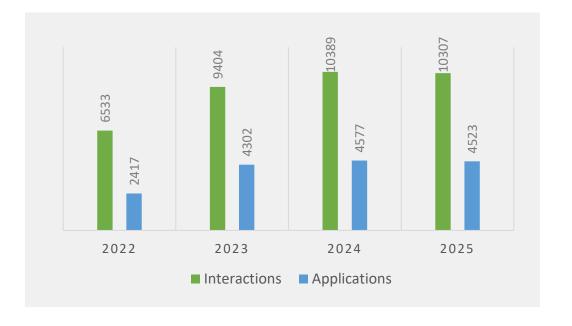
