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Dear Roger Lane, Members of the ZLR Committee, and Staff,

Thank you for allowing residents to speak at the revocation hearing September 2, 2025.

The residents who support revocation focused on the violations and their history. It was disappointing that the friends of the operator spent so much time and effort trying to direct attention away from the reasons for the hearing and focus instead on emotions and sympathy.

This hearing was the result of violations of the CUP and departures from the operating plan. A new operating plan has been submitted because the one on which the CUP was granted, failed. According to ZLR rules, these departures from the original plan are major and should require a new CUP. These are the facts.

This is about the violations. They were repeated and misrepresented. The operator ignored the operating plan, blamed others, said he misunderstood the rules, and offered false information about truck traffic, blasting, landscaping, selling topsoil and other activities. His actions have endangered the public health and safety of the community.

They have made a mockery of ZLR regulations and required nearly constant monitoring for two years. Despite the last-minute scramble to comply, there is no evidence this will change. Trust is gone.

This has never been about a small group of complaining neighbors. Over the past five years the large group of residents writing emails, signing petitions, showing up for meetings, and speaking at hearings has not been trying to say that all quarries everywhere are bad - but that this particular operation in this community is not a good fit. In response, residents have experienced intimidation, harassment and lawsuits.

It's also not about small businesses, veterans, patriots, employees' welfare, the Town Board, the DEI office next door, drone tours etc. It is about two years of serious violations.

As I did at the revocation hearing, I am speaking for Rutland residents who do not wish their names made public, as they do not want any more harassment or lawsuits.
