

Dane County Opioid Settlement Funding
2025 Designated Spending

OutReach **\$ 115,000**

1.5 FTE opioid overdose prevention positions to work with marginalized communities including the LGBTQ+ community, as well as currently and formerly incarcerated individuals. Activities include providing peer support for individuals at greatest risk of opioid overdose, distributing harm reduction materials, assessing community needs in this area, and facilitating the Pride in Prevention Coalition.

Safe Community Coalition of Madison and Dane County **\$ 40,000**

Provision of school-based harm reduction curricula and implementation assistance to Dane County schools, which provide developmentally appropriate prevention and harm reduction education.

Rebalanced-Life Wellness Association **\$ 100,000**

Harm reduction and case management services.

Dane County Sheriff's Office **\$ 70,000**

Re-Entry Counselor – The Sheriff's Office received a grant to fund 2.5 re-entry positions in 2024. The positions did not start until the fall of 2024 and the funding was for 1 year. Through the county budget process, the funding for the remainder of 2025 was funded utilizing some of the opioid settlement money.

The primary responsibility of our new re-entry team is meeting with clients who come through central booking. Their goal is to pre-screen each client as they arrive and connect them with the necessary resources. The following resources are provided: food, housing, state identification and duplicate driver's licenses, social security cards, birth certificates, employment assistance, parenting support, mental health services, substance use disorder resources, health insurance, primary care, and medication access.

Emergency Management Services **\$ 141,438**

Opiate Specialist Position and Narcan Leave Behind Program

Public Health (2024 RES-143)

\$ 331,200

Staffing and related costs for syringe and other harm reduction services including distribution of safe smoking supplies, education on and distribution of Narcan, and distribution of test strips for Fentanyl and Xylazine.
