APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN DANE COUNTY AND THE CITY OF MADISON FOR TYPE III HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE TEAM

Policy Analysis Statement:

Brief Description of Proposal -

Dane County is required to have a Countywide Strategic Plan to be eligible for EPCRA Planning Grant funds. An element of the plan is to identify a local emergency response team that is capable of responding to a Level B hazardous materials release. Dane County and the City of Madison have contracted for several year. The intergovernmental agreement will allow this service to continue.

Current Policy or Practice -

Major contracts require County Board and County Executive Approval

Impact of Adopting Proposal -

This agreement would all for the Type III Hazmat Service to continue to be provided by the Madison Fire Hazardous Incident Team. The agreement will also allow the County to remain eligible for EPCRA Planning Grant funds.
