Site Host Selection Update

EV Advisory Commission Meeting, May 19, 2025

Consistent with our grant application, we will select site hosts via a competitive process.

Recall that we are seeking 60-70 site hosts that meet at least one of our priorities, which are:

- 1. High-density urban and suburban areas where residents lack access to private charging networks
- 2. Rural areas where the private charging market is less likely to install charging stations
- 3. Multi-modal transportation hubs where EV charging can support public and active transit options

How Does Selection Work?

Interested hosts must <u>apply via a Request for Proposals process</u> consistent with Dane County procurement rules.

- The RFP for site hosts will be posted on the Dane County system; we'll share out the link once it is live.
- Applications are due Friday, June 13 at 2:00 pm.

At the May 19 EV Advisory Commission meeting we will talk about <u>ways that EV Advisory Commission</u> <u>members can help</u> to promote this opportunity so that we receive a robust response to the RFP.

What Happens After June 13?

- 1. After the RFP deadline, a Dane County team will <u>review the submissions</u> to determine which sites meet at least one priority and seem viable. Then, the KL Engineering team will do a desktop review of those initial sites to further verify the viability of the sites.
- 2. The County will sign an agreement with the sites that pass that technical verification
- 3. The KL Engineering team will do the initial <u>on-site design and environmental review</u>, which will give Dane County the information we need to request construction dollars from FHWA.
