4 **ESTABLISHING AN INDEPENDENT FORENSIC AUDIT OF DANE COUNTY FUNDS GIVEN**
5 **TO URBAN TRIAGE OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS**

6 On September 13, 2024 and October 8, 2024, respectively, the Cap Times and the Wisconsin
7 State Journal reported that the nonprofit Urban Triage has exceeded its budget by \$100,000 for
8 providing housing assistance to homeless people.

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10 Given that Urban Triage has been the recipient or administrator of \$32,152,658 taxpayer dollars
11 from Dane County government since 2020, the Dane County Board of Supervisors wants to
12 address and resolve any further allegations regarding Urban Triage's mismanagement of
13 taxpayer resources.

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15 The Dane County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes an independent forensic audit of
16 Urban Triage's financial records as they relate to any funding provided at any time by Dane
17 County government to this organization.

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Dane County Board will request the Dane
20 County Purchasing division to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) from certified public
21 accounting (CPA) firms to conduct a forensic audit of Urban Triage's financial records.

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23 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the selected firm must be an independent CPA firm with no
24 political or business ties to Dane County government, the City of Madison, or the Dane County
25 nonprofit community, and that a contract for services must not exceed \$90,000 for the audit.

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27 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that any contract for an independent forensic auditor of Urban
28 Triage shall include provisions for making the following determinations:

29 (1) whether the CEO of Urban Triage and its Board of Directors have fulfilled their fiduciary
30 responsibilities and duties under state and federal laws (Sarbanes Oxley, IRS Rules governing
31 nonprofit, OIG 1-156 & Incident Reporting) and (2) whether Urban Triage's Board of Directors
32 and/or its CEO and/or its employees, have participated in financial misconduct, financial fraud,
33 financial misfeasance, gross mismanagement, and/or misapplication of Dane County and
34 federal funds, which includes but is not limited to:

35 (a) nepotism, political patronage, and the use of Dane County funds for political activities
36 such as lobbying and influence peddling;

37 (b) enrolling people who are ineligible for the Dane County Homeless Rental Assistance
38 program;

39 (c) conflicts of interest by board members, the CEO, or employees of Dane County;

40 (d) failure to report all revenues and expenditures from Dane County and/or federal
41 funds, and failure to report the use of those funds for activities other than the intended
42 purpose of delivering services, such as for Urban Triage's alleged trip to Puerto Rico;
43 and

44 (e) a review of all Urban Triage CEO emails and communications with Dane County
45 Supervisors, Dane County employees, and members of the Dane County Health &
46 Human Needs Committee during the last three years.

47
48 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the contract provisions of the forensic audit shall include a
49 determination of whether Urban Triage's RFP applications for Dane County and federal funds
50 were, in fact, accurate, and that no false statements were made on Urban Triage's application
51 or by the CEO and /or employee(s) of Urban Triage, including but not limited to inaccurate or

52 false information on resumes, dates of Urban Triage's IRS nonprofit filing, and the official
53 authorization letter by the IRS authorizing Urban Triage to function as a nonprofit.

55 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the independent auditor that contracts with Dane County will
56 be required to share its report and findings in a public meeting of the Dane County Board
57 Executive Committee, as well as in a special meeting of the Dane County Board.

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59 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the County Board designates any future contract with Urban
60 Triage, regardless of the amount of the contract entered into with Urban Triage, to be a major
61 contract, per Section 25.04(10) of the Dane County Ordinances, requiring County Board
62 approval.
