1 Legislative Updates: JPA Trailer & RETF

IAUSLY reported on the Judicial Privacy Act (JPA) trailer and Real Estate Transfer Fee (RETF) legislation.

For the JPA there is 2025 AB-171 and 2025 SB-169 that have passed out of committee and are to be scheduled for action by the full Assembly and Senate. IAUSLY went over some highlights of bill.

For the RETF, IAUSLY reported that 2025 AB-216 has gone before the Assembly Committee. To date, it has not gone to the Senate. There was a concern by the Governor's Office that it may affect ARPA funding, but this has been resolved. However state budget conflicts between the Legislature and the Governor are an issue and affects the bill.

2 2026 LIO Budget

MUELLER presented and discussed with the council the LIO's 2026 projected budget. With the continued reduction in documents being recorded with the Register of Deeds, it will impact the LIO budget by reducing the LIO reserve fund.

3 Esri Licensing Fees

MUELLER and WATSON reported to the council on the Esri licensing and the consideration of some different options based on the Esri pricing schedule. In March of 2026, Esri will but into effect their user based license for their suite of products. This will increase the county licensing costs. There was discussion on this with the council. The LIO is considering covering the licensing for 2026, but this will further reduce the reserve fund. But in 2027, a different model for paying for licensing will be needed.

4 AccessDane and City of Madison Data Sharing

VIOLANTE and FRICK reported to the council that the long established data sharing process with the City of Madison Assessors Office has run into some issues. In mid-2024 the City Assessors Office changed the system that they were using that provide the county with a useable data load. This results in gaps in the data that the county is receiving and it continues to get worse. To date they have not been able to schedule a meeting with Planning & Development, Treasurer, Information Management and City Assessor and IT.

5 DCIMap Upgrades

CONFARE reported on the upgrade to DCiMap and provided a demonstration of the new webmapping app. CONFARE shared that some of the new functionality is due to an agreement with a private developer to work with Dane County as a beta-tester on the development of new widgets for DCiMap.
