2023 RES-120 AMENDING THE 2023 CAPITAL BUDGET FOR THE PURCHASE OF SHERIFF VEHICLES The Sheriff's Office needs to replace twenty-nine patrol vehicles in 2024. Supply chain issues around the world are causing delays in vehicle manufacturing. The county has been informed that the orders for vehicles that will be placed in service in late 2024 or early 2025 must be placed in October of 2023. If the vehicles are not ordered in October 2023, the county will miss the entire 2024 model year. Further, the 2025 model year is will be a redesign by Ford, which may delay the production for that year as well.
It is vital for the Sheriff's Office to meet Ford's order window so that older vehicles can be retired within their warranty period which, prevents increases in maintenance costs and ensures availability of

injury or death to Deputies or the public.

Therefore, the Sheriff's Office is seeking an amendment to the 2023 Capital budget so that it can order vehicles that will be delivered in late 2024 or early 2025. The estimated cost of these vehicles is \$1,522,500. The county will not need to pay for these vehicles or borrow the associated funds until 2024 when they are delivered.
