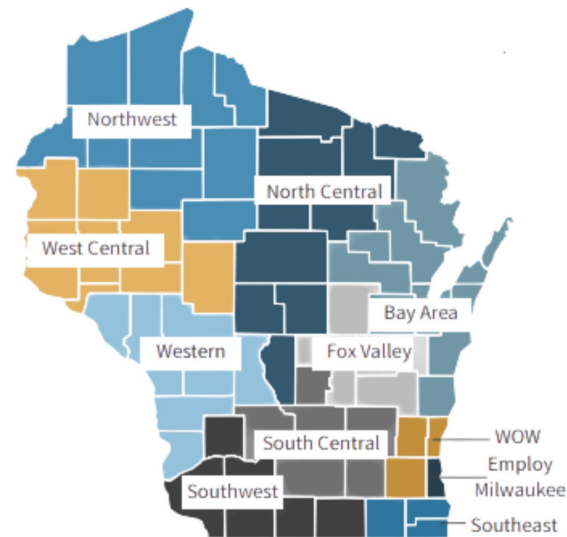

WIOA Title 1

The **Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)** is a federal law designed to help job seekers access employment, education, training, and support services.

Title 1 focuses on Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth employment and training programs.

- **Adult Program:** Provides training, job search assistance, and career services for adults
- **Dislocated Worker Program:** Aids individuals who have lost their jobs due to layoffs or other reasons
- **Youth Program:** Offers career exploration, education, and job training for young people aged 14-24
