Initial Classification

- Arresting officer's observations and input regarding the resident;
- Central Booking deputy's observations and input regarding the resident;
- Nature and severity of offense committed by the resident;
- Perceived vulnerability of the resident;
- Mental status of the resident;
- Medical condition of the resident;
- Resident behavior and level of cooperation during arrest and admission;
- Prior institutional and criminal history of the resident;
- Resident responses to medical and mental health intake screening;
- Resident level of intoxication and/or drug use;
- Escape risk of the resident; and
- Custody status of the resident.

Additional

- 1. Deputies assigned to housing locations shall ensure the separation of residents by sight and sound, as follows:
 - a. Male from Female residents.
 - b. Adults from juveniles who have not been waived into adult court.
 - c. Those with suspected or diagnosed communicable diseases from other residents.
- 2. Deputies assigned to housing locations shall make all reasonable efforts to separate residents identified as the following:
 - a. Residents who represent a threat to themselves, other residents, staff, or security of the institution.
 - b. Residents with significant medical, physical, mental, or emotional disabilities.
 - c. Residents noted as Keep Separate in the Sheriff's Office Records Management System.
 - d. Adult (age 18 and over) from youthful residents (under the age of 18). (PREA 115.14)

Primary Classification

- Information obtained during the initial screening;
- Any additional relevant information received since the initial screening;
- Information obtained by completion of the PREA Risk Screening form;
- Criminal history; and
- Past/Current institutional behavior.
- PREA Risk Screening
 - o whether the resident has a mental, physical, or developmental disability;
 - the age of the resident;
 - o the physical build of the resident
 - o whether the resident has previously been incarcerated;
 - o whether the resident's criminal history is exclusively non-violent;
 - whether the resident has prior convictions for sex offenses against an adult or child;
 - whether the resident is or is perceived to be gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, intersex, or gender non-conforming;
 - o whether the resident has previously experienced sexual victimization;
 - o the resident's own perception of vulnerability; and
 - o prior acts of sexual abuse;
 - o prior convictions for violent offenses; and
 - o history of prior institutional violence or sexual abuse, as known to the agency


Re-Classification

Classification and Hearing staff shall reclassify residents under the following circumstances:


- A change in the custody status of a resident (court activity).
- Following a disciplinary hearing on a resident (as warranted).
- Upon request from jail staff.
- As a result of an incident of sexual abuse, or upon receipt of additional information that bears on the resident's risk of sexual victimization or abusiveness. (PREA 115.41[g])
- Residents may request a review of their classification status by submitting a request slip to Classification. Residents may also appeal a classification decision through the Formal Grievance System.

Classification Diagram



Determining Eligibility

Check Spillman

- · Check for Release date
- Skip those that have the institutional class of SPED, JUVE, INWK
- · Check Security Class
- Check all offenses can't just go by judicial status
 - o Cash bail?, Recog?, Probation Revoked?

CCAP everyone regardless of Judicial status

- Review all open cases as there may be different hearings in each case depending where it is at in the court process
- Skip if Motion to Modify Bail recently filed Bail hearings are added on quickly
- For Sentencing after Revocation Hearings, check the case number on the offenses as this will be a closed case
- Skip those that have a jury trial within the next month
- Eligible if hearing is 3 weeks in the future for Oneida
- Eligible if hearing is at least 2 weeks in the future for Rock/Iowa
- Skip those that are participating in Drug Court weekly review hearings see list from Br4
- Skip those that have upcoming hearings in juvenile court

Sentenced

- · Status of Jail Diversion?
- · Skip if Resident worker
- Check w/Rec Deps in case they are in hiring process

Iail Revocation Hearings

- Eligible if the hearing is in the future and can be facilitated by the housing county
- If revocation decision is in and awaiting ROW, I check CCAP to see if sentence is withheld, imposed and stayed, or the potential exists for re-confinement time

Probation Holds

Only those pending revocation will be eligible

Maintenance-Check everything again Weekly (Mondays)

- Check outcome of court dates of those returned to determine if they can be rehoused.
- Check court dates weekly for those housed in other counties in advance of transport day.

Medical/Mental Health

- Can the medication the resident is taking be administered in another county?
- Is the resident receiving Vivitrol or Suboxone?
- Are there mental health needs that would keep the resident in Dane County?
- COVID test if showing signs

If Competency is raised the resident isn't eligible to be reallocated


- Upcoming Competency Hearing is scheduled
- Order of Commitment for Treatment was entered
- Participating in Jail Based Competency Restoration
- · Awaiting inpatient treatment bed

Resident Refusal

- · Residents can refuse.
 - When a resident refuses relocation, the resident will be pending a due process hearing for a major rule violation.

Additional Considerations

- Re-Entry needs
- Check keep separates of residents who are already reallocated
- Rock County doesn't not accept females currently
- Residents needing to be kept separate for court cases, behavior, etc.
