General Conditions

- A. The State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ("Department") and the Grantee (collectively the "Parties" and individually a "Party") agree to perform this agreement in accordance with s. 287.17(10)(fm), Wis. Stats. and in accordance with Grantee's application, including any attachments thereto, which is attached and made a part of this agreement, and any amendments and Exhibits to this agreement (together the "Agreement.")
- **B.** This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any previous communications or agreements pertaining to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- C. Terms used in this Agreement shall have the same meanings provided for at s. 287.17(1), Wis. Stats.
- **D.** Any changes to this Agreement, including cost adjustments and scope changes, must be made by an amendment to this Agreement, signed by both parties, prior to the Grant Agreement End Date as provided above. Amendments to extend the Grant Agreement End Date to a later date may be granted by the Department in writing without the requirement of Grantee signature.
- **E.** Grantee may submit to the DNR E-Cycle Wisconsin program coordinator requests for amendments to this Agreement, in writing, identifying the specific proposed changes to the Agreement. Grantee shall show good cause for any requested amendment to the Agreement and the Department shall not unreasonably deny any such amendment.
- F. All communications with respect to this Agreement shall be made to:
 - 1. With respect to the Department, the DNR E-Cycle Wisconsin program coordinator at <u>DNRWIe-cycling@wisconsin.gov</u>.
 - 2. With respect to the Grantee, the Grantee Authorized Contact as identified above.
- **G.** Grantee shall have sole control of the method, hours worked, and time and manner of any performance under this Agreement other than as specifically provided in this Agreement. The Department takes no responsibility for supervision or direction of the performance of the Agreement which is to be performed by the Grantee or the Grantee's employees or agents. The Grantee is an Independent Contractor for all purposes, not an employee or agent of the Department. The Department exercises no control over the selection and dismissal of the Grantee's employees or agents.
- **H.** The Department reserves the right to inspect the job site or premises to ensure that the performance is progressing or has been completed in compliance with the Agreement.

Grantee's Obligations

- I. Grantee shall immediately notify the DNR E-Cycle Wisconsin program coordinator of any change in the status or purpose of the grant.
- **J.** Grantee shall comply with all applicable state, local and federal law in fulfilling terms of this Agreement including compliance with the requirements of chs. 287 and 289, Wis. Stats. and rules promulgated thereunder.
- **K.** Grantee shall register any electronics collection sites or events funded under this project with E-Cycle Wisconsin in accordance with s. 287.17 (7), Wis. Stats. and follow all requirements of s. 287.17, Wis. Stats.
- L. Grantee may only expend grant funds to support collection of eligible electronic devices from Wisconsin households and covered schools. At each site or event funded under this Agreement, Grantee shall accept all

eligible electronic devices listed at s. 287.17 (1) (gs), Wis. Stats. Grantee shall send all eligible electronics collected at a site or event funded under thus Agreement to a recycler registered under s. 287.17 (8), Wis. Stats.

- **M.** Grantee shall save, keep harmless, defend and indemnify the Department and all its officers, employees and agents, against any and all liability claims, costs of whatever kind and nature, for injury to or death of any person or persons, and for loss or damage to any property (state or other) occurring in connection with or in any way incident to or arising out of the occupancy, use, service, operation or performance of work in connection with this Agreement or omissions of the Grantee's employees, agents or representatives.
- N. Grantee, in connection with the performance of work under this agreement, shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, disability, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability as defined in s. 51.01(5), Wis. Stats., sexual orientation or national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Grantee shall take affirmative action to ensure equal employment opportunities, as required by law. The Grantee shall post notices to be provided by the contracting officer setting forth the provisions of the nondiscrimination clause in conspicuous places available for employees and applicants for employment.
- **O.** Grantee shall conform to generally accepted accounting principles and practices for project funds and to record project funds in a separate account. All financial records, including invoices and canceled checks, that support all project costs claimed by the Grantee, shall be kept and made available for inspection for three (3) years after final payment is issued by the Department.

Payment

- **P.** Department promises, in consideration of the covenants and agreements made by the Grantee, to pay Grantee the E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount as provided above, which represents no more than 80% of total actual and eligible project expenses.
- **Q.** All actual and eligible expenses must be incurred or obligated by Grantee after the Grant Agreement Start Date and prior to the Grant Agreement End Date provided above.
- **R.** Grantee shall submit one claim for payment of actual and eligible expenses on the forms provided by the DNR ("Final Claim for Payment") within 60 days of the Grant Agreement End Date provided above (the "Final Claim Period"). All costs claimed for payment by Grantee must be documented and consistent with the eligibility provisions of s. 287.17 (10) (fm), Wis. Stats. and Exhibit 1 to this agreement. If a collection site or event accepts non-eligible electronics, Grantee shall pro-rate costs incurred relating to such site or event in approximate proportion to the weight of eligible vs non-eligible electronics or otherwise in a manner agreed to by the Parties.
- **S.** The Department is not obligated to reimburse any claims for payment received after the end of the Final Claim Period. Before the end of the Final Claim Period, Grantee may request in writing an extension to the Final Claim Period. Grantee shall show good cause for any extension of the Final Claim Period and the Department shall not unreasonably deny any such request for an extension.
- **T.** Total actual and eligible expenses for the project must be equal to, or greater than the proposed Total Project Cost provided above. In the event total actual and eligible expenses for the project are less than the Total Project Cost, the Department may amend the E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount to reflect 80% of the actual and eligible expenses.
- U. The Final Claim for Payment must include all of the following:

- 1. An itemized final summary of all actual and eligible expenses for the project, detailing actual costs of any eligible expenses and identifying which expenses have been used to meet the 20% Project Sponsor Share as provide above.
- 2. A completed Grant Payment Request and Worksheet (Form 8700-001), available through E-Cycle Wisconsin webpage.
- 3. Copies of invoices or other proof of purchase for all eligible expenses.
- 4. Copies of receipts, cancelled checks or other proof of payment for eligible expenses.
- 5. If the recipient is requesting reimbursement for staff expenses, documentation (e.g., from a time reporting system) showing staff hours/expenses directly related to the planning, promotion and operation of the site or event.

Performance and Failure to Perform.

- V. Grantee may decline the E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount provided through this Agreement, in writing, at any time prior to Grantee incurring any actual or eligible project expenses. In the event Grantee declines the E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount, such action renders this Agreement null and void and releases the Department of any obligation to pay to Grantee any E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount under this Agreement.
- **W.** After Grantee has incurred actual and eligible project expenses, this Agreement may be cancelled only by mutual agreement of the Parties in writing.
- X. Except as provided in Paragraph 25, in the event the Grantee fails to comply with this Agreement:
 - 1. Grantee shall release Department of any obligation to pay to Grantee any E-Cycle Wisconsin Collection Grant Amount under this Agreement.
- **Y.** If, in the sole discretion of the Department, failure by Grantee to comply with this Agreement is due to no fault of the Grantee, such failure shall not release Department of its obligation to pay to Grantee for actual and eligible expenses incurred by the Grantee in performance of its obligations under this Agreement. In such event:
 - 1. The Parties shall cancel this Agreement;
 - 2. Grantee shall submit to the Department a Final Claim for Payment in accordance with paragraph 19 within 60 days of cancelation; and
 - 3. The Department shall pay 80% of actual and eligible expenses for the project provided in the Final Claim for Payment.

The person signing for the Grantee represents both personally and as an agent of his or her principal that he or she is authorized to execute this agreement and bind his or her principal, either by a duly adopted resolution or otherwise.

E-Cycle Wisconsin Electronics Collection Grant Program Agreement Exhibit 1: Expenses eligible and not eligible for grant funding

The following expenses related to hosting an electronics collection site or event are reimbursable under this grant program. The grant recipient may incur these expenses directly, or they may be included in services provided by a partner, vendor or contractor.

- 1. Rental costs for facility or event site. This could include rental of buildings, event grounds or trailers.
- 2. Materials necessary to host the collection site or collection event. Examples include:

Permanent collection sites	One-day collection events
Packaging materials (pallets, shrink wrap, Gaylords or other containers, material needed for safe shipment of lithium-ion batteries)	Packaging materials (pallets, shrink wrap, Gaylords or other containers, material needed for safe shipment of lithium-ion batteries)
Personal protective equipment for site workers	Personal protective equipment for event workers
Forklifts, pallet jacks, lift trucks or similar equipment used to move pallets/containers and/or load them in a truck	
Sheds, tarps or other material necessary to protect electronics from weather, breakage or vandalism	
Security equipment (cameras/security systems, locks, gates, signs)	

- 3. Advertising costs for the site or event. Examples include:
 - Design and printing of handouts, posters, signs, etc.
 - Creation of video or audio ads.
 - Paid digital, print, TV or radio ad space/time.
- 4. Staff expenses for the site or event, including administrative costs. Examples include:
 - Salaries, hourly wages and fringe benefits (not to exceed current state rate of 47.66%) for staff time to plan, promote or operate a collection site or event.
 - Mailing/printing costs.
- 5. Costs to transport collected devices to a registered recycler.
- 6. Construction of new or improvements to structures, such as new buildings or building improvements; new site development to improve access; or improvements to encourage efficient handling of electronics, such as concrete slabs or paving and loading ramps.

Contact DNR E-Cycle Wisconsin staff with any questions about the eligibility of other expenses, or for instructions on completing an application for sites or events in multiple locations.

Expenses must be incurred during the period specified in the signed grant agreement. Any expenses incurred before or after the grant agreement period will not be reimbursed.

Expenses NOT eligible for grant funding

The following expenses are not eligible for reimbursement or to count toward the 20% match requirement:

- 1. Costs for recycling (processing) eligible electronics after they have arrived at a registered recycler.
- Direct costs for the collection, transportation or recycling of electronics not used by households or K-12 schools, or for electronics that do not meet the definition of eligible electronic devices. For example,

costs to pick up electronics from a business or to ship a load that only contains electronics from a business to a registered recycler cannot be reimbursed under the grant.

- 3. In-kind costs, such as volunteer hours or the use of space or equipment already owned by the grant recipient at the time the grant agreement is signed.
- 4. Staff wages, salaries or fringe benefits not directly related to planning, promoting or operating a collection site or event.
- 5. Purchase of office equipment, such as computers, phones or copy machines, that will be used for activities other than hosting the collection site or event.
- 6. The purchase of real property.

A collection site or event may also accept non-eligible electronics, including electronics that were not used by a household or K-12 school, but should pro-rate expenses accordingly. For example, if a load shipped to a registered recycler contains approximately 20% (by weight) business material or non-eligible devices, only 80% of the cost for shipping that load would be eligible for reimbursement.
