
# How the Latino Academy has Contributed to Wisconsin's Workforce

- Strong partnerships with local Workforce Development Boards and local Department of Workforce Development.


# Latinos are Wisconsin's Fastest Growing Population

- 447,290 Latinos in Wisconsin.
- Average age is younger than the general population.
- Wisconsin's labor force participation rate is declining; in July '22 was 66.2%, down from a peak in 2000 of 73.2%.
- In Dane County, Wisconsin, Latinos represent 6.5% of the population, but 12% of the workforce.



# Latino Academy Work-Based Learning






#### CDL Student: Allan Tejeda

The Latino Academy has recently celebrated its 22-23 CDL and GED graduation. It was our biggest graduating class in the history of the agency. Allan Tejeda shared some inspiring words with all the graduates. As an immigrant from Honduras and father of four he talked about his journey to provide for his family and secure a future for all of them. He had been working at KS Energy long enough to have the skills to be able to fulfill every position at the company. However, his desire and requests to become a foreman always ended with the same words: "you need to have a CDL license for that." The \$6,000 tag on the driving schools and the need to be on unpaid leave to prepare for the tests made it unreachable for him. He came to the Latino Academy for an unrelated matter the same day we were having our first CDL class. After learning about it, he travelled to the class site and he never looked back. With our free class and the paid training provided in partnership with the Wisconsin Development Board of SCW he was able to join our classes from 8 to noon and then work at night to complete the modules for the test. He didn't miss a single day of class and all this effort paid off by obtaining his CDL Class-B license and his longed-for position as a foreman that allows him to now oversee all his company's business in Dane County. He mentioned that this time it was he who set the conditions of his employment and he is now making \$33 per hour. He was grateful for every staff person that played a role in joining and completing his CDL, which shows the significance the tiniest of actions has in our students. Allan's success story is a testament of hard work, dedication, persistence, and making the best of opportunities.



#### CDL student: Miriam Morales

I have been a student with Latino Academy since 2019. At the time I was a Dental assistant. Looking for a way to secure a better future for my son and I, the timing couldn't have been better. I saw an ad from Latino Academy offering a CDL class A & B License. Obtaining the class A I knew I would be able to achieve my goal. Taking evening classes and providing daycare for my son while attending class was so helpful and motivating. I realized what else can I ask for? Free education that provides support with my son so I can further my education. At many times the emotions would get to me and they still do when I stop to think about it. Being grateful for this opportunity with all the emotions it was more encouraging to me having Latino Academy as my support system. I knew it was up to me to take advantage of this opportunity and do my part and of course I was willing to put in all my efforts. In 2020 Latino Academy introduced and prepared me with mocking interview and education skills I needed to land an opportunity for my family. I also obtained my class A CDL License. I am now the 1st Latina woman to finish and graduate a Dane County Internship with the Dane County Highway Transportation Department as a skilled Labor.



## GED student: Arbey Castillo

I started my journey with Latino Academy in 2021 taking ESL classes. Then I decided to start the GED program so I would have access to post-secondary education here in the US. I already have a college degree from my native Colombia, but I wanted to go through the process of obtaining the diploma in the US. During this process, I was able to connect with my peers in the class and create a collaborative learning environment that ended up creating review sessions among peers in which we all supported each other. I have also attended all the Latino Academy Career Fairs, and that's where I found my current employment. I have been talking to my employers to assume more responsibilities once my English skills improve, even with the possibility of moving abroad to direct a branch of the company in Mexico.

I am currently a computer instructor with the Latino Academy, which allows me to use the skills I brought to this country. I have also become the Pre-GED Math instructor, so I can guide the prospective GED/HSED students to show them what's to come for them.
