Behavioral Health Division Services

- Most Behavioral Health services are not provided in-house
- More than 150 Contracts for Behavioral Health Programs
- Most contracts are offered via bids/RFPs, which typically run on a 5 year cycle
- The process is intended to limit inequities in the contracting process

DCDHS Programs to Support the Criminal Justice System

Madison Area Recovery Initiative (MARI)

- **What it is:**

- Pre-arrest and pre-charge diversion program which offers six months of individualized treatment and coaching to participants.

- **Eligibility:**

- Facing eligible charges for a non-violent offense stemming from the disease of addiction
- Eligible charges include possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a controlled substance, retail theft, prostitution, and theft/burglary if the victim of the theft/burglary agrees to the MARI program being offered.

- **Completion:**

- Arrest diverted; charge never filed

Addiction Resource Team (ART)

- **What it is:**

- Law enforcement and peer support outreach to those who have overdosed, or their families. Provides Hope kits (harm reduction materials), and offers support connecting to resources. Conducts regularly scheduled outreach

- **Eligibility:**

- Individuals identified by City of Madison Police or Madison Fire personnel as struggling with an Opioid Use Disorder

Community Treatment Alternatives

- **What it is:**

- Community Services Program (CSP) developed to decrease the frequency and duration of psychiatric hospitalizations and legal problems, and increase self-esteem, independence, and life satisfaction
- Provides wide array of services including medication evaluation, prescribing, and monitoring, case management, counseling, housing navigation, daily living assistance, and more.

- **Eligibility:**

- Meets criteria identified in DHS 63; and
 - Currently incarcerated in the Dane County Jail; or,
 - Pending criminal charges that could result in incarceration in the Dane County Jail; or,
 - Identified as a Dane County Jail Familiar Face; or,
 - Has extensive history interfacing with the criminal justice system

- Time unlimited program

Dane County Drug Treatment Court

- **What it is:**

- Post-conviction treatment court which requires regular court appearances and participation in treatment

- **Eligibility:**

- Felony level drug driven charge
- The current charge must not be considered a violent charge per statute 941.291(1)(b) and involve no weapons
- Dane County resident and over the age of 18 years old
- Identified as having Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment need and willingness to be treated
- Must be determined to be at high risk to reoffend as identified by their COMPAS score
- Must agree to participate in behavioral changing programs and services

- **Completion:**

- Diversion from incarceration

Dane County Diversion Program

- **What it is:**

- Post-charge diversion program which requires regular court attendance and participation in treatment

- **Eligibility:**

- Felony level drug driven charge
- The current charge must not be considered a violent charge per statute 941.291(1)(b) and involve no weapons
- Dane County resident and over the age of 18 years old
- Identified as having Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment need and willingness to be treated
- Must be determined to be at medium risk to reoffend as identified by their COMPAS score
- Must agree to participate in behavioral changing programs and services

- **Completion Result:**

- Reduction or dismissal of charges

Dane County OWI Court

- **What it is:**

- Post-conviction treatment court which requires regular court appearances and participation in treatment

- **Eligibility:**

- Dane County Resident
- OWI 3rd Conviction
- BAC .20 or higher
- Must be placed on probation, with mandatory compliance of OWI treatment court as a condition
- Not currently or previously charged with an OWI related death or serious personal injury
- Finding of alcohol dependency or suspected dependency on Intoxicated Driver Program Assessment

- **Completion:**

- Reduction of jail sentence

Wellpath Vivitrol Program

- **What it is:**

- Program to provide Vivitrol injection to incarcerated individuals prior to release, while also establishing post-release treatment plan including re-entry peer support and/or case management

- **Eligibility:**

- Incarcerated at the Dane County Jail
- Interested in Vivitrol injection
- Medically and clinically appropriate, as determined by clinician and medical staff

Just Dane Re-entry Services

- **What it is:**

- Program which provides re-entry peer support services and/or case management services
- Offered in both English and Spanish

- **Eligibility:**

- Dane County resident (18 or older)
- Incarcerated at the Dane County Jail
- At medium or high risk of reoffending and returning to jail
- Not presently connected to a case manager at another agency
- Mental health and/or substance use treatment needs

Community Restorative Court (CRC)

- **What it is:**

- Pre-arrest and pre-charge diversion program which requires participant accept responsibility of their actions, and participate in the restorative justice process. Restorative justice process involves the participant, victim, and a trained peacemaker creating an agreement to repair the harm done.

- **Eligibility:**

- 17-25 years old
- Misdemeanor charge or municipal citation including disorderly conduct, simple battery, obstructing an officer, criminal damage to property, or theft

- **Completion:**

- Diversion from arrest and charge

Community Service Program

- **What it is:**

- Program to allow individuals the opportunity to complete community service hours in lieu of a jail sentence or fine

- **Eligibility:**

- Adults sentenced by the Dane County Circuit Court for non-violent criminal charges, and sentenced to perform community service hours for no less than eight hours, maximum of 240 hours, in lieu of a fine or period of incarceration.

- **Completion:**

- Incarceration and/or fine dismissed
