- · Outdoor recreation participation increased dramatically both nationally and locally during the pandemic
- Post pandemic participation rate of increase is moderating but appears to be maintaining higher levels than pre-pandemic
- Running, walking, hiking, biking, and fishing were the top 5 most popular national recreation activities
- Dog exercise areas, biking, hiking, fishing, boating, camping, outdoor education, and disc golf continue to be popular activities in Dane County Parks

- Dane County has one of the most diverse populations in the state









The Natural Resource Program Area merged land restoration and forestry teams. These teams have grown significantly in staff size and impact over the last several years. Forestry and restoration work are important parts of implementing Dane County's Climate Action Plan.

- 1. Maintain and enhance county parkland natural areas through invasive species control, native seeding/planting, and prescribed fire.
- 2. Maintain and enhance county parkland tree canopy through regular tree pruning, planting and caring for young trees, storm damage and hazard tree response, and tree disease and pest control.
- Work with the Real Estate Coordinator and LWRD Divisions to convert agricultural fields on parkland to permanent cover
- Apply for grants to support forestry and land restoration projects
- Incorporate volunteers in land restoration and forestry as safe and appropriate
