BACKGROUND

- The Dane County Legislative Agenda gets updated every two years by the County Board.
- The Agenda is used as:
 - A **guide and planning document** for the legislative lobbyist for what to lobby the Wisconsin State Legislature and the governor's office on for the County, including for the next legislative session.
 - A **resource to create handouts** for state legislators or help shape testimony on issues for committees as the Legislature considers legislation over the next few years.
- If something is not included on the agenda, I will **go before the Executive Committee to explain the issue and ask if they wish to have the County weigh in or not**

REVIEW PROCESS

- The **legislative agenda** is listed by issue area. Each of the standing committees is responsible for reviewing the areas that are relevant to their committee
- An **updated working document** was created to streamline categorization of items, reduce redundancies and adjust language based on recent legislative or administrative action
- A **supporting document for each standing committee** has also been created to help guide the process and discussions

DOCUMENT EXAMPLES

Current Legislative Agenda:

- 152 • **Dental Access:** Support increased access to dental care for all residents,
 - 153 including those on Medical Assistance.
 - 154 • **Medicaid Expansion:** Support implementation of the Medicaid expansion
 - 155 under the federal Affordable Care Act (ACA). Accept available federal funds
 - 156 for BadgerCare to ensure that thousands of Wisconsin citizens have access

 - 162 in key funding areas from the state including Youth Aids, Basic Community
 - 163 Aids, Children and Families Allocation, Aging and Disability Resource
 - 164 Centers, Income Maintenance, Children's Community Options Program, and
 - 165 Children's Long Term Support Program.
 - 166 • **Gender-affirming care:** Support access to gender-affirming care and
 - 167 procedures and oppose any legislation with restrictions based on gender
 - 168 identity.

- 172 • **Income Maintenance Programs:** Support funding levels and legislation that
 - 173 provide sufficient resources to administer non-cash benefit programs such
 - 174 as Food Stamps, Medical Assistance, Child Care and issue benefits to all
 - 175 eligible people. Oppose changes to the eligibility/enrollment process and
 - 176 services funded under Medicaid and Income Maintenance, which limit
 - 177 eligibility and could reduce the number of people receiving benefits.
 - 178 • **Childcare:** Support sufficient funding for childcare. Expand eligibility to
 - 179 include childcare support for low-income individuals pursuing higher
 - 180 education leading to employment.
 - 181 • **Tax Supports for low-income residents:** Support increasing the state
 - 182 percentage of the federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and expanding
 - 183 eligibility for the Homestead Tax Credit program.
 - 184 • **Property Tax Exemptions Low Income Housing:** Clarify 70.11 Wis. Stats.
 - to define "maintenance" as "repair and maintenance of property, capital
 - replacements, insurance premiums, project management, debt retirement,

- 185 project-related reserves, general administrative expenses, resident
- 186 services, utilities, financing costs, preservation expenses and similar
- 187 project-related expenses."
- 188 • **Centralization of Economic Support Programs:** Oppose initiatives to
 - 189 remove income maintenance administration from counties and create a
 - 190 centralized income maintenance unit.
 - 191 • **Medicaid Funding:** Support enabling counties to accept/administer
 - 192 Medicaid funding at the county level.
 - 193 • **Drug Testing:** Oppose legislation that would enact drug testing as a
 - 194 requirement for public benefits. Also oppose drug testing of youth in our
 - 195 public schools.
 - 196 • **Health Care Workforce:** Support state and federal workforce development
 - 197 funding to increase the number of health care and mental health
 - 198 professionals in Wisconsin.
 - 199 • **Paid Leave:** Support paid family leave for workers.

Updated Working Document:

- 127 • **Expand Health Care and Dental Access:** Support increased access to dental
 - 128 care for all residents, including those on Medical Assistance. Support
 - 129 implementation of Medicaid expansion and support Medicare for All Act to ensure
 - 130 everyone has access to high quality, universal health care without the interruptions
 - 131 in care present in an employer-based, for-profit system. Support care that is
 - 132 gender-affirming and oppose any legislation with restrictions based on gender
 - 133 identity. Oppose undue hardship in eligibility/enrollment of safety net programs,
 - 134 such as legislation that would enact drug testing as a requirement for public

- benefits. Support state and federal workforce development funding to increase the number of health care and mental health professionals in Wisconsin.
- **Increase State Funding and Support:** Support adequate funding for Youth Aids, Basic Community Aids, Children and Families Allocation, Aging and Disability Resource Centers, Income Maintenance, Children's Community Options Program, Children's Long Term Support Program and administrative services under Medicaid and Income Maintenance agencies, including FoodShare.
 - **Prioritize Family-Supporting Economic Policies:** Support sufficient funding for childcare and reduce barriers to accessing affordable childcare, support paid family leave, support increasing the state percentage of the federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and expanding eligibility for the Homestead Tax Credit program.
 - **Access to Comprehensive and Equitable Health Care:** Support codifying the protections of *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey* into Wisconsin and federal law. Oppose all efforts to restrict abortion and reproductive care, and support expanding access to comprehensive reproductive health services for all individuals. Advocate for the continuation and expansion of the Wisconsin Well Woman Program, and support legislation allowing medical marijuana for individuals with debilitating conditions when recommended by a physician. Support policies that create breastfeeding-friendly workplaces.
 - **Public Health and Community Support Initiatives:** Support policies that extend postpartum Medicaid eligibility to a full year and expand Medicaid to include a housing benefit for pregnant and postpartum individuals. Increase staffing and resources for the state's maternal mortality review process. Support the certification and Medicaid reimbursement of Community Health Workers for services within their scope of practice. Encourage increased state funding for nutritious school meals, such as the Healthy School Meals for All Act. Support state-level reforms that enable counties to enact stronger local ordinances regulating dangerous animals and vicious dogs.
