### Intent/Justification

In the summer of 2019, Jefferson Rodriguez, an 8-year-old Nicaraguan boy died after being struck by a 6,700-pound skid steer near a milking parlor where he had been living with his father who worked on the farm. This devastating tragedy received broader community attention when ProPublica published an investigative report in February 2023. The report highlights many contributing factors that led to the tragedy, including legal loopholes that leave farm workers, particularly dairy workers, inadequately protected from unsafe and unjust working and living conditions. As the home to more than 2500 farms, Dane County needs to take the lead in creating safe and stable homes for farmworkers and prioritize the most vulnerable immigrant farmworkers in this effort. Hiring a consultant(s) to study the scope of this need, engage the farmworker community and other stakeholders, and develop policy and funding recommendations will assist Dane County in the development of a safe farmworker housing program. The remaining funds may be used for planning, land acquisition, and development costs.
