

## Why Plan for Cultural Resources?

- ► Each year, Dane County absorbs the largest population increase in Wisconsin. Given such rapid growth, how can Dane County:
  - Preserve the archaeological and architectural heritage of a land that has been continuously settled for 12,000 years or more?
  - ► Foster civic pride in its communities through acknowledgement and preservation of heritage?
  - Utilize cultural resource planning to serve as an engine for economic growth?
  - Incorporate archeological sites, historic structures, and cultural heritage into growing and evolving communities?



## Dane County Comprehensive Plan Adopted Goals for Cultural Resources

- 1. Encourage permanent protection, interpretation and maintenance for all identified Dane County archaeological sites of significance.
- 2. Protect, preserve and restore buildings, structures, sites, landscapes, natural features and districts which represent or reflect elements of Dane County's cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history.
- 3. Increase public awareness and appreciation of historic and archaeological resources.
- 4. Identify, record and evaluate archaeological, historic and cultural resources and sites.



## Wisconsin Comprehensive Planning Law on Cultural Resources

Comprehensive plans must include:

S. <u>66.1001(2)(e)</u>, <u>Wis Stats.</u> Agricultural, natural and cultural resources element. A compilation of objectives, policies, goals, maps and programs for the conservation, and promotion of the effective management, of ... <u>historical and cultural resources</u>, community design, recreational resources and other natural resources.




Assist communities in protecting and educating citizens about historic resources

## Dane County Heritage

- Dane County has:
  - ▶ 13,476 sites listed on the Wisconsin Architecture and History Inventory.¹
  - ▶ 260 listings on the National Register of Historic Places²
  - ► Highest density of effigy mounds in the world³
    - ► An estimated 1500 mounds built in Tejope
    - ► An estimated 80% have been destroyed by agriculture and urban expansion
  - ▶ 443 Dane County Historical Markers⁴
  - 5 Rustic Roads<sup>5</sup>












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
