Values of MPD's Mental Health Unit

- **Problem solving:** We believe in identifying the underlying issues creating police calls and reducing them.
- **Collaboration:** We engage with partners from across the government, civil society, families and consumers to improve systems, relationships, and outcomes.
- **Diversion:** We aim to reduce the involvement of criminal justice in mental health issues and the criminalization of mental illness.
- **Professional development:** We seek increased knowledge and expertise within the unit and to share our knowledge and experience with the department at large.

Composition of MPD's Mental Health Unit (MHU)



A vast majority of mental health crises are serviced by MPD's **Patrol Officers.**

MPD's Mental Health Unit (MHU) provides added support to community members and to first-responding officers before, during, and after a mental health crisis occurs.

- Our Mental Health Liaison Officers (MHLOs) are officers and Sergeants assigned to Patrol who voluntarily participate in additional training and take on additional tasks to promote the Mental Health Unit's values.
- Our **Mental Health Officers (MHOs)** serve in a specialized role and are assigned to MPD district stations.
- Our Law Enforcement Crisis Workers (LECWs) are mental health clinicians employed by Journey Mental Health



More on Diversion

- Wisconsin's Chapter 51 provides that law enforcement may perform an Emergency Detention on a person under certain circumstances.
- When an individual has behaved in a **dangerous but non-criminal** manner, officers are trained to make observations of accompanying signs and symptoms and consult with Journey Mental Health to arrive at an appropriate disposition.
- When a consumer has behaved in a **dangerous and criminal** manner, and if an Emergency Detention is appropriate, officers are trained to pursue hospitalization (stabilization/treatment) first.



2022 MPD CHAPTER 51 ACTIVITY




