AUTHORIZING GRANT FUNDING FROM THE OFFICE OF NATIONAL DRUG CONTROL POLICY, MILWAUKEE HIGH INTENSITY DRUG TRAFFICKING AREA (HIDTA), GRANT G23ML0014A

The Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) provides funding for law enforcement agencies to participate in the HIDTA Program. The HIDTA Program, created by Congress with the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, provides assistance to federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies to operate in areas determined to be critical drug-trafficking regions of the United States. This resolution authorizes acceptance of HIDTA Grant funding to reimburse the Sheriff's Office for criminal investigations involving drug trafficking and money laundering activities in order to reduce drug trafficking and drug production in the region.

The HIDTA Grant award amount is \$135,000, Grant Number G23ML0014A, period of performance is 1/1/2022 – 12/31/2024 (two-years), grant activities shall be reimbursed quarterly upon submission of approved reimbursable claims to the Milwaukee HIDTA. This grant shall also support staff benefit costs for the Anti-Heroin, Anti-Methamphetamine, Project Safe Neighborhood, and the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force Grants.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the Dane County Executive is hereby authorized to execute the grant agreement on behalf of the County of Dane and, the Sheriff's Office is hereby authorized to accept ONDCP grant funding, administered by the Milwaukee HIDTA, for criminal investigations involving drug trafficking and money laundering activities, in the amount of \$135,000; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that \$135,000 is appropriated as revenue in the Sheriff's Office, Field Services, Drug Enforcement HIDTA Grant Revenue (SHRFFLD 80726) account line and is credited to the General Fund; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that \$135,000 is transferred from the General Fund to the following Sheriff's Office account lines:

# A. General Terms and Conditions

- 1.
