I represent the HOA board for the Lost Creek neighborhood in Madison. We are located directly across Marsh Road from the farm parcel purchased by the quarry last year. Our neighborhood has been fully affected by the quarry for many years now and have had to push back against the in the last few years for trying to illegally create larger boundaries. They were cited and reprimanded by Dane county for these actions. It makes us wonder if the quarry owners and management are knowledgeable on the legality of their business, or prefer to ask for forgiveness instead of permission. I wonder what else they have done that would earn a citation. The Lost Creek HOA board would like to vote against the CUP that is being proposed by Trierweiler construction. We feel there are better options that won't be as disruptive to traffic and noise pollution as this specific spot will be. The proposal will affect more than 5 neighborhoods which I would like to believe the county would be looking out for more than saving a small amount of taxpayer dollars. There are other quarries nearby to the DOT project that should be considered highly before this is red stamped without more neighbor debate.
