## 1. Wisconsin Senior Advocates

OLSON reported this group is focusing on the Supreme Court Judge election and Expanding Medicaid. The group is submitting advocacy to AARP to help with this advocacy.

## 2. ADRC Governing Board

OLSON reported that the board is having two public hearings-one in person and one virtually with specific topics for the public to answer. #### 3. County/State/Federal Legislative Update

Dane County Lobbyist Carrie Springer reported Nutrition is being addressed with funds going to food banks to keep them supplied with food for citizens. Transportation issues are on the Dane County Legislative agenda. SPRINGER reported the State Budget includes, ADRC funding, Nutrition, and expanding Medicaid but nothing from the Federal level on these areas.

#### 4. State's Aging Advisory Council

OLSON reported Senator Gwen Moore out of Milwaukee is proposing a bill to end the Social Security cap.

#### 5. Wisconsin Aging Advocacy Network

OLSON reported Senior Advocacy Day will be coming up and committee needs to decide how to be involved. Will be in-person at the capitol building and is a chance to meet with legislators and what are the needs of older adults.
