AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF STEWARDSHIP GRANT FUNDING FROM THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE WAUCHEETA CONNECTOR TRAIL

Dane County Parks applied for Department of Natural Resources (Department) Stewardship grant funding in 2022 for development of the Waucheeta Connector Trail. The proposed trail will provide walking and biking connections between Goodland County Park, Capital Springs Centennial State Park, William G. Lunney Lake Farm Park, the Capital City Trail and Lower Yahara River Trail. It will also provide a more bicycle friendly route for cyclists riding from the Capital City Trail to Lalor Road in the Town of Dunn.

In August of 2022 Dane County Parks was notified by the Department that although they were in support of the proposed project, there were insufficient funds available and the grant request was declined. In March of 2023, the Department notified Dane County Parks there was \$144,000 of unspent 2022 Stewardship grant funds available for the project.

Construction of trail is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2023. The Department will draft a forthcoming trail easement document that will outline roles and responsibilities for the County to develop, operate and maintain the trail through Capital Springs Centennial State Park lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dane County Board of Supervisors and County Executive authorize acceptance of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource Stewardship grant funding in the amount of \$144,000.

BE IT FURTHER-FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Land & Waters Resources Director, Dane County Parks Director and the Parks Planning and Development Manager are authorized to execute documents necessary to submit grant reimbursement requests to the WDNR and the County Executive is authorized to sign the grant agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Dane County Board of Supervisors and the Dane County Executive herby authorize the Department to convey an easement to Dane County for the Waucheeta Connector Trail.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a new revenue account CPLWRESC "Lower Yahara River-Trail Stewardship Grant" be established for \$144,000 and expense account CPLWRESC 57780 Lower Yahara River Trail be increased by \$144,000.

Legal Description (hereinafter referred to as Property):

- 2. This Contract, together with any referenced parts and attachments, shall constitute the entire Contract and previous communications, understandings, representations or contracts pertaining to the subject matter of this Contract are superseded. Any revisions, including cost adjustments, shall be made by a written amendment to this Contract, signed by both parties prior to the termination date of the Contract. Time extensions and scope changes to the Contract may be granted to the Sponsor by the Department in writing without the requirements of Sponsor signature.
- 3. Failure by the Sponsor to comply with the terms of this Contract may not cause the suspension of all obligations of the State if, in the judgment of the Secretary of the Department, such failure was not the fault of the Sponsor. In such case, any amount required to settle at minimum costs any irrevocable obligations properly incurred shall be eligible for assistance under this Contract, at the Department's discretion.

The Project Sponsor:

- 4. Agrees to comply with all applicable state, local and federal statutes and regulations in fulfilling terms of this Contract, including but not limited to, general and special zoning, land use permit requirements, disability access, environmental quality, historical and archeological preservation. In particular, the Sponsor agrees to comply with the provisions of Chapter NR 51, Wis. Adm. Code, as well as comply with all applicable local and state contract and bidding requirements. The Sponsor should consult its legal counsel with questions concerning Contracts and bidding.
- 5. May decline the offer of financial assistance provided through this Contract, in writing, at any time prior to the starting of the project and before expending any funds. After the project has been started or funds expended, this Contract may be rescinded, modified, or amended only by mutual written agreement of the parties.
- 6. Agrees, to save, keep harmless, defend and indemnify the Department and all its officers, employees and agents, from and against any and all liability claims, costs of whatever kind and nature, for injury to or death of any person or persons, and for loss or damage to any property (state or other) occurring in connection with or in any way incident to or arising out of the occupancy, use, service, operation or performance of work in connection with this Contract or omissions of Sponsor's employees, agents or representatives.
- 7. Agrees to reimburse the Department of any and all funds the Department deems appropriate in the event the Sponsor fails to comply with the conditions of this Contract or project proposal as described, or fails to provide public benefits as indicated in the project application, proposal description or this Contract. In addition, should the Sponsor fail to comply with the conditions of this Contract, fail to progress due to non-appropriation of funds, or fail to progress with or complete the project to the satisfaction of the Department, all obligations of the Department under this Contract may be terminated, including further project cost payment.
- 8. Agrees, in connection with the performance of work under this Contract, not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, disability, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability as defined in s. 51.01(5), Wis. Status, sexual orientation or national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Sponsor further agrees to take affirmative action to ensure equal employment opportunities, as required by law. The Sponsor agrees to post in conspicuous places available, for employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Contracting officer setting forth the provisions of the nondiscrimination clause.
- Agrees not to discriminate against any person in the use and enjoyment of the property on the basis of age, race, creed, color, handicap, marital status, conviction record, arrest record, sex, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation or membership in the national guard, state defense force or any other reserve component of the military forces of the United States or this state.

- 11. Agrees that income accruing to the Property shall be used to further the objectives of the project as stated in this Contract or to further the objectives of another Stewardship project. However, if the Property is entered into the County Forest Law Program, income derived from that program shall be distributed according to s. 28.11 Wis. Stats.
- 12. Shall maintain financial and accounting records for the grant in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and practices. These records may be reviewed by state officials.
- 13. Shall display a sign at the property acknowledging funding through the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
- 14. by Wisconsin Department of Administration, State Controller's Office, if Grantee expends federal grant funds totaling \$750,000 or more during the fiscal year and the those funds were received from a State or Federal agency.

The Department:

- 15. Promises, in consideration of the covenants and Contracts made by the Sponsor, to obligate for the Sponsor the amount shown as "State Aid Amount" on page 1, and to tender to the Sponsor that portion of the obligation which is required to pay the Department's share of the costs based upon the state providing 50 percent of eligible project costs. The Sponsor promises, in consideration of the promises made by the Department, to execute the project described in accordance with this agreement.
- 16. Agrees that the Sponsor shall have sole control of the method, hours worked, and time and manner of any performance under this agreement other than as specifically provided in this document. The Department reserves the right only to inspect the job site or premises for the sole purpose of insuring that the performance is progressing or has been completed in compliance with the agreement. The Department takes no responsibility of supervision or direction of the performance of the agreement to be performed by the Sponsor or the Sponsor's employees or agents. The Sponsor is an Independent Contractor for all purposes, not an employee or agent of the Department. The Department further agrees that it will exercise no control over the selection and dismissal of the Sponsor's employees or agents.

B. Special Conditions:

- Property acquired or developed with assistance from this program shall not be converted to uses inconsistent with public outdoor recreation without the prior written approval of this Department.
- 2. Total cost sharing provided through any combination of state and federal funds shall not exceed 100% of all eligible costs.
- 3. Prior to construction, the Sponsor (County) is required to obtain legal right to constructed, operate, and maintain the trail from the Department.
- 4. All applicable permits, licenses and approvals, including water and wetland regulatory permits and approvals, required by federal, state or local agencies must be obtained prior to project construction and complied with fully during project construction and the life of the project.
- 5. Erosion control will be accomplished using the guidelines in the Wisconsin Construction Site Best Management Practice Handbook. Construction sites associated with land disturbing activities over one acre within 500 feet of a surface water body require an erosion control plan prepared by the Sponsor, to be submitted to the Department of Natural Resources for approval. Surface bodies include permanent flowing streams, ponds and lakes. Construction sites disturbing more than five acres of land require a permit for stormwater discharges from construction sites to be issued by the Department of Natural Resources.
- 6. All existing overhead utility services if feasible shall be buried and any new utility services provided through this project must be installed underground.
- Stormwater permits are required if grading >1 acre, and filling or grading in wetlands requires a Corps of Engineers and Department permits.
- 8. Development plans must be submitted to the Department for approval prior to any construction.
- 9. All facilities constructed with assistance from this program must be accessible to persons with disabilities. All facilities developed with these grant funds shall be connected by linkage trails to a main walkway and/or parking lot.
- 10. If the project involves construction or renovation of parking facilities, the sponsor shall provide accessible parking that meets or exceeds requirements of the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design, state requirements, or local requirements, whichever is most stringent. A minimum of one stall must be van accessible.
- 11. Recommend Voluntary Conservation Measures for Pollinators
 - a. For prescribed fire, mowing/haying, grazing, pesticide use and tree clearing/thinning, follow the voluntary conservation measures listed in the Conservation Management Guidelines for the Rusty Patched Bumble Bee (Bombus affinis) https://www.fws.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ConservationGuidanceRPBBv1 27Feb2018 0.pdf
 - b. For all other activities, follow the general voluntary measures listed below:
 - 1. use native trees, shrubs and flowering plants in landscaping,
 - 2. provide plants that bloom from spring through fall, (Wisconsin Native Plant Species List),
 - 3. remove and control invasive plants in any habitat used for foraging, nesting, or overwintering.
- 12. Recommended measures for Blanding Turtle: Work in gravel and/or sandy soils within 900' of a wetland should be done outside of the Blanding Turtle nesting season which runs from May 20 to October 15 (i.e. work done between October 16 and May 19). The installation and maintenance of exclusion fencing using the WDNR Amphibian and Reptile Exclusion Fencing Protocol is an avoidance option that

can be used during this period as long as the exclusion fencing is installed between October 16 and May 19. Work can then be conducted within the fenced area at any time of year as long as the fencing is maintained. If avoidance dates and fencing cannot be implemented, it is recommended to walk through or gently disturb the project area immediately prior to disturbance. This may allow turtles to move out of the area and avoid impacts. If a turtle is found, please carefully move it to suitable habitat outside the project area.

- 13. Conditions related to invasive species movement. The applicant and operator agree to the following methods required under s. NR 109.05(2), Wis. Adm. Code for controlling, transporting and disposing of aquatic plants and animals, and moving water:
 - a. Aquatic plants and animals shall be removed and water drained from all equipment as required by s. 30.07, Wis. Stats., and ss. NR 19.055 and 40.07, Wis. Adm. Code. when moving equipment between surface water or wetlands.
 - b. Operator shall comply with the most recent Department-approved 'Boat, Gear, and Equipment Decontamination and Disinfection Protocol', Manual Code # 9183.1, available at http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/invasives/disinfection.html
