ACCEPTING STATE OF WISCONSIN DNR SURFACE WATER AIS PLANNING GRANTS

The Dane County Land & Water Resources Department manages an aquatic plant
harvesting program for county waters. Harvesting follows permit requirements from the
Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR), which includes approved aquatic
plant management plans for each waterbody where harvesting occurs. Harvesting of
aquatic vegetation, both native and invasive, only occurs in WDNR approved locations.

In order, the priorities of the aquatic plant harvesting program are to:

- 1. Improve flow through the Yahara River for flood mitigation;
- 2. Provide recreation and navigational access through access lanes to open water;
- 3. Target invasive and nuisance plans; and
- 4. Accommodate special events as time and budgets permit.

The WDNR has awarded two surface water aquatic invasive planning grants to assist
Dane County in updating the aquatic plant management plans for Lakes Monona and
Mendota. Dane County will seek additional grants in future years to update aquatic plant
management plans for other water bodies where aquatic plant harvesting occurs.
