## Major Takeaways

Share of elderly population is growing at an accelerating rate

Rural areas of Dane Co. see higher single occupancy household and poverty rates

Common challenges of mobility and chronic health management are amplified with reduced access to services in rural areas


Rural counties are particularly reliant on AAAs, as they account for 85 percent of counties with populations of individuals 65 and older that make up 20 percent or more of their total population.



Counties operate and fund 25 percent of the 625 Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) across the nation and another 28 percent operate within regional planning councils or councils of governments that often include counties.


56 percent of AAAs rely on local funding streams through counties or other local governments to provide additional programs and services.

## Community Aging in Place-Advancing Better Living for Elders (CAPABLE) - Johns Hopkins School of Nursing

- Home-based program that integrates services from an occupational therapist, a registered nurse, and a handy worker who work together with seniors to set direct action plans to improve health and independence


## Innovative Programs

SMiles Transportation - Blount Co., TN

- Volunteer rural transportation service with over 130 drivers and almost 200 residents served

Livingston County Help For Seniors - Livingston Co., NY

- Training and utilizing EMTs to screen and refer seniors to health resources

ARcare Aging Well Outreach Network - Cross Co., AR

- Network of case managers connecting seniors to cooking classes, support groups, exercise opportunities, and transportation services
