1 2022 RES-347 2 ACCEPTANCE OF NATIONAL FISH AND WILDLIFE FOUNDATION GRANT SUB-AWARD 3 FROM ICE AGE TRAIL ALLIANCE 4 5 Dane County Parks has secured \$124,250 in funding from the Ice Age Trail Alliance as a grant 6 7 sub-award of a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation grant to supports enhanced collaboration 8 with partner organizations to multiply efforts in pollinator habitat restoration work. 9 Dane County Parks staff and volunteers work on hundreds of acres of county parkland annually 10 to restore natural communities and improve pollinator habitat for the monarch butterfly, karner 11 12 blue butterfly, rusty patched bumble bee, regal fritillary, and other pollinators. The federally 13 endangered rusty patch bumble bee is known to be found in several Dane County Parks. 14 NOW. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board of Supervisors and the Dane 15 County Executive hereby accept \$124,250 in funds from the Ice Age Trail Alliance; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive and the County Clerk be authorized to 19 sign the grant agreement letter; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Parks Director and Parks Botanist/Naturalists are authorized to submit reimbursement claims along with necessary supporting documentation 22 23 upon project completion, and take necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete 24 approved projects; and 25 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that revenue account LWRPKOP "NEW" "IATA NWFW Pollinator 26 27 Grant" be created by \$124,250 and LWRPKOP 10079 "LTE-Land Management/Restoration" 28 increase by \$99,100, LWRPKOP 10108 "Social Security" increase by \$8,209 and LWRPKOP 21377 "Land Management Supplies" increase by \$16,941. All Funds shall be carried forward 29 until realized and expended. 30
