ACCEPTING AND ALLOCATING REVENUE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH UNWINDING DCDHS – EAWS DIVISION

Dane County Department of Human Services (DCDHS) Economic Assistance and Work Services
(EAWS) Division is seeking authority to accept and allocate funding from the state Department of
Health Services to aid in its preparations for the public health unwinding.

9 10 During the duration of the public health emergency associated with COVID-19, there have been a 11 variety of policies that have been authorized at the federal level to maintain health care coverage and 12 to financially support struggling families. Examples of these policies include continuous coverage for 13 Medicaid and extra allotments for FoodShare households. Now that the public health emergency is 14 being lifted, federal and state regulations maintain that income maintenance policies for eligibility for 15 these programs be "unwound" and return to pre-pandemic procedures. As a result, customers will 16 lose access to extra FoodShare benefits and all Medicaid households will need to have their eligibility 17 renewed for the first time since 2020. This "unwinding" will cause a large spike in EAWS workload in 18 addition to significant community disruption. 19 20 The state Department of Health Services has made \$794,116 available to the Capital Consortia 21 (which includes Dane County as the operational and fiscal lead in addition to our partner counties 22 of Sheboygan, Adams, Richland, Sauk, Columbia, Dodge and Juneau). The Dane County portion 23 of this allocation is \$474,630 and the remainder will be passed through to the partner counties. 24 The intent of these resources is to help income maintenance agencies like EAWS/the Capital 25 Consortia plan for and mitigate the impact of the large workload spike associated with unwinding. 26 This workload spike will be felt for a full twelve month period starting in April 2023. 27

28 The DCDHS/EAWS division, which administers income maintenance and is the lead for the 29 Capital Consortia, seeks approval to allocate this funding for two primary purposes in Dane County. The priority purpose is to fund \$347,427 in additional overtime for Economic Support 30 31 staff who will be tasked with helping a large influx of phone and lobby customers seeking to 32 understand how unwinding will impact their benefits. EAWS also seeks use a small portion of the 33 allocation to fund social media outreach to help stakeholders, advocates, POS agencies and 34 others understand what unwinding means and how its impact will be felt in Dane County. Finally, 35 a small reserve of this funding will be allocated for additional equipment, supplies and services 36 that may be needed during this time. 37

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following revenue account be adjusted and that the
revenue increase be credited to the County General Fund and transferred from the General Fund to the
following expenditure accounts in the Department of Human Services:
